

BASIS – Bracing Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis Study – night-time versus full-time bracing in adolescent idiopathic scoliosis

Named PubMed Collaborator Agreement

The BASIS study team have agreed a points system whereby staff not listed in the BASIS Publication & Dissemination Plan can gain "PubMed citable" collaborator system, to recognise the role clinical staff can have in research.

The criteria to determine an individual's collaborator status are:

Activity	Points	Evidence/ suggestions
GRANULE Course Go to https://learn.nihr.ac.uk/course/ and register using an NHS e-mail address.	2 points	- GRANULE Certificate
Recruitment of participants	4 points per recruit	- Named on parent consent/patient assent form as person taking consent

10 points or above = named PubMed citable collaborator

It is the responsibility of the individual to provide evidence to the Sheffield CTRU team that they have achieved the required 10 points, made up from any combination of the above.
