

## **ODDSocks - Named PubMed Collaborator Agreement**

This information sheet details the agreement between Oxford Trauma and ODDSocks Collaborators

- Oxford Trauma values the role clinical staff can have in research.
- Oxford Trauma seeks to involve orthopaedic trainees, ED trainees, specialist nurses, physiotherapists and consultants in all studies where possible.
- Oxford Trauma commits to provide evidence of participation in studies as part of CPD.
- Oxford Trauma intends to name individuals who can demonstrate these criteria as named PubMed collaborators on submitted manuscripts. This will be subject to journal policy.
   Collaborators will be acknowledged in the primary clinical paper unless otherwise stated.

The criteria for determining an individual's collaborator status are:

Consent & Randomisation	5 per recruit	- Recruitment certificate
Training a colleague	0.5 per colleague trained (Max of 3 points)	- Updated training & delegation logs in REDCap
Completion of the NIHR Associate PI scheme for the ODDsocks Trial	4 points	- Associate PI Certificate
BONUS Points – Recruitment to any other ongoing Oxford Trauma paediatric trial (CRAFFT/ BigBOSS/ OpNonSTOP)	1 point per recruit (Max 2 points)	- Recruitment certificate

## 10 points and above - named PubMed collaborator.

It is your responsibility to present evidence to the Trial Team when you accumulate 10 points or more.
