

PIC Bone - Named PubMed Collaborator Agreement

For collaborative membership rights (citation on PubMed without the need to meet ICJME authorship requirements).

This information sheet details the agreement between Surgical Interventions Trials Unit (SITU) and PIC Bone Collaborators

- SITU values the role clinical staff can have in research.
- SITU seeks to involve orthopaedic trainees, ED trainees, specialist nurses, physiotherapists and consultants in all studies where possible.
- SITU commits to provide evidence of participation in studies as part of CPD.
- SITU intends to name individuals who can demonstrate these criteria as named PubMed collaborators. This will be subject to journal policy.
- Collaborators will be acknowledged in the primary clinical paper unless otherwise stated.

The criteria for determining an individual's collaborator status for PIC Bone are:

Activity	Evidence
Recruiting and consenting 20 or more patients to the prospective arm of PIC Bone Study.	Screening and Consent signoffs on REDCap database, reports provided by Clinical Study Team.
OR	
Completing 100 or more records into the retrospective arm of the PIC Bone Study.	Sign-offs on completed Screening and Results forms on REDCap database, reports provided by Clinical Study Team.

It is your responsibility to present evidence to the Trial Team when you fulfil the above criteria.
